Resolution: Authorization to Extend Hurrell-Harring Counsel at Arraignment Grant (COHHA02) from Office of Indigent Legal Services	Peter Brown presented a resolution on behalf of Leanne Lapp to extend the Hurrell-Harring Counsel at Arraignment Grant until the end of the year. Supervisor Greg Bendzlowicz motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Mark Venuti. The motion carried.

Resolution: Acceptance of Grant from Emergency Management Preparedness Grant Program (EMPG FY21 ~ CFDA #97.042) Ontario County Emergency Management Office	Jeff Harloff presented a resolution to accept a grant from Emergency Management Preparedness Grant Program in the amount of \$44,402. He plans to use the funds to begin replacing 700 MHz radios that have outlived their life cycle. Supervisor Todd Campbell motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Greg Bendzlowicz. Resolution: Authorization to Accept Quote for Scuba Gear Annual Maintenance (Q21070) Resolution: Acceptance of Bids for Purchase of Incarcerated Individuals Uniforms and Linens for the Ontario County Correctional Facility (B21077) Resolution: Authorizing Contract with Mosaic Health Dental Services for Incarcerated Individuals – Ontario County Jail Approval: Invoice 19803BC from Lenco Armored Vehicles i/a/o \$281,688.00 – Mary Gates Informational: Jail Population	Chief Falbo presented the following three resolutions for approval: • Accept quote Q21070 for scuba gear • Accept bids B21077 for uniforms and lines for the inmates at the jail • Contract with Mosaic Health Dental for services at the jail. Supervisor Bendzlowicz motioned to approve the three resolutions as a block, seconded by Supervisor Campbell. It was clarified the amount is not to exceed \$60K per term and not per year for the dental contract. The motion carried. Deputy Chief Falbo presented an invoice for approval to pay for the armored vehicle in the amount of \$281,688. Discussion took place regarding how the payment would be made; whether by check or ACH wire. Supervisor Greg Bendzlowicz motioned to approve the payment, seconded by Supervisor Mark Venuti. The motion carried. Chief Falbo reviewed the jail population: • Current – 86 • Females – 13 • Weekend High – 92 • Sentenced – 29 • Parole violations – 6 without additional criminal charges
COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR	
Updates	Chris DeBolt gave the following updates: • The General Covid update: they continue to see an average of 30 cases a day; 40% are children under 18 years of age. There is a significant cluster in the Victor School District • They are working on getting the testing in schools up and running. They have the contract and logistics with Quadrant. • They are working closely with the School Superintendents. • The goal of Public Health is to keep the kids in the classroom • For healthcare workers, they had their regional call with the 11 counties on Monday. The counties with nursing homes did have to

	let go a number of staff members. Hospitals are at capacity and nursing homes are not accepting new patients. • Vaccine clinics are going on at the County Transportation Center (CTC). Clinics will pick up over the next 6 weeks.
209 Committee	
	Supervisor Todd Campbell gave the following update on the 209 Committee: • They had their first meeting on September 23rd. • Supervisor Campbell appointed Supervisor Peter Ingalsbe as his Vice Chair to the Committee. • The 209 language is specific, they went through the rules and procedures for the committee. • They spent a lot of time in executive session and he wants to make it clear that the committee was clear in its direction; when they have an executive session, it will only include members of the committee, county staff and outside counsel. All others will be asked to step out. • They have issued their first round of subpoenas. • The next meeting will be next Thursday at 11:00 am with a location to still be determined. •

Supervisor Greg Bendzlowicz motioned to approve the resolution, seconded by Supervisor Cathy Menikotz. The motion carried with Supervisors Lou Guard and Mark Venuti voting no. Supervisor Daryl Marshall had disconnected from his virtual link therefore was absent for the vote.
