Sheriff David Cirenione gave the following updates:

- Jail Population; 98 total, 78 males, 20 females, 81 unsentenced, 16 sentenced, 1 in on civil family court issue, 3 housed out, and 152 transports for the month of October
- They held their first ever Corrections Basic School with 13 students, 5 of whom were from the Ontario County Sheriff's Office. This will put them at 9 vacancies for Jail Corrections. In January 2023 there were 20 vacancies.
- They hosted the 911 2-week basic school. Nine graduated, four were from OCSO which will fill 4 vacancies for 911 out of 28.
- They held a drug drop at the Village Hall in Victor. They took in over 400 pounds of drugs and needles.
- They had a tip in the jail about contraband in one of the cells. Their new jail K9 was called in and turned over contraband, leading to increased safety measures and possible criminal charges.
- The holiday luncheon is on December 6th at the jail.

8. County Administrator:

Alissa Bub gave a quarterly ARPA grant status update. The ARPA recipients are being contacted by their consultant to ensure completion. Follow up is underway with two grant recipients who are not under contract for ARPA funding. If they don't hear from them, they may have to pull the funding. Ms. Bub reminded the committee that the United Way campaign begins this week and will run until December 6th.

Supervisor John Cowley motioned to enter executive session at 10:19 am regarding POL§105 1) (f) - Discussions on the medical, financial, credit or employment history of a particular person or corporation, or matters leading to the appointment, employment, promotion, demotion, discipline, suspension, dismissal or removal of a particular person or corporation.
