Informational: 2021 Audit Review Informational: Contract list 2021 Informational: Year in Review 2021 Updates	Eileen Tiberio presented information regarding the 2021 audit review, the list of contracts they had for 2021, and a report for their year regarding children services and what the County Attorney's office does for the Department of Social Services. Holly Adams thanked Ms. Tiberio and her staff and the attorneys in her office for the terrific work they have been doing regarding Children's Services. Ms. Tiberio noted that last year she came to the committee with a proposal, with a concern about the end of the eviction moratorium, to set aside \$500,000 to help keep people from becoming homeless after the eviction moratorium ended. She said she did not end up taking the proposal to the Ways and Means Committee primarily because the state has come out with two initiatives. They expect to have more information by the next cycle; if she thinks they really need to go forward with the proposal, she will let this committee know and then take it to the Ways and Means Committee to get their approval. She went on to explain that one of the things the state has come through with is money for a subsidy program. She said the other thing they have when it comes to unexpected expenses ins the foster care system. The state has a Maximum State Aide Rate (MSAR), but as a result of a lawsuit that has been resolved, as of last month, the state has been ordered to make it a minimum state reimbursement rate. They fully expect the cost for placements will rise. Finally, they have secured a security company for the departments within 3010 County Complex Drive and locations in Geneva.

He explained several members of the public health staff lost annual leave. He knows this is an ongoing issue. They have been working hard as a county to enforce the two-week annual leave roll over cap. He noted two staff members who stand to lose the majority of the time given their workload that has been placed in the department in response the pandemic. He said he had a request from several supervisors and from the department and put this resolution together with help to address it. However, it was brought to his attention, these are members of the CSEA bargaining unit and they need a MOU to affect what is spelled out in the resolution. He has gotten some advice from HR to better understand what the impact to the larger organization as a whole might be to this action. He would like to just keep this resolution as informational until next cycle.

Resolution: Reappointment of Eileen M. Tiberio Commissioner of Social Services	Chris DeBolt presented a resolution to reappoint Eileen M. Tiberio as the Commissioner of Social Services with a five-year term from February 15, 2022 through February 14, 2027. Supervisor Fred Wille noted it has been a pleasure to work with Eileen over the past seven years and we are fortunate to have such a great leader who really thinks about families, individuals, and children so deeply and effectively. Mr. DeBolt gave the following updates: • They are in the process in distributing KN95 masks to the schools. • If the towns would like any, please let him know. • They found an opportunity to purchase at home tests; they coordinated with the other eleven counties of the region and ordered 300,000 tests (150,000 test kits). • They also purchased 50,000 of KN95 masks. • Both will be distributed. • On behalf of the region that was requested from Genesee and Orleans County, he drafted a letter to the Governor to consider softening of her booster mandate for healthcare workers. It was similar to the letter they sent back when she announced the vaccine mandate for healthcare workers. • The Fire and EMS study is underway. • There will be a resolution coming through the Board appointing a search committee for a Deputy County Administrator.

**AUTHORITY TO USE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE PROVIDERS
THAT ASSIST WITH COVID 19 VACCINATION CLINICS in 2022**

WHEREAS, Resolution 374-2021 authorized payments and the use of emergency medical service providers that assist with COVID-19 vaccination clinics; and

WHEREAS, The Federal Government accelerated the development of vaccines to help protect our nation's residents; and

WHEREAS, The Governor and New York State Department of Health received vaccine and prioritized the administration of vaccine and recommended Emergency Medical Services (EMS) be present during the distribution to respond to any adverse reaction of the vaccine; and

WHEREAS, Ontario County Public Health received its first allocation of vaccine and began vaccination POD's (Point Of Dispensing) in early January 2021 and requested the assistance of EMS providers to monitor and respond to any adverse reactions of vaccinated individuals; and

WHEREAS, The amount of time spent by EMS providers at vaccination POD's has been a drain on their resources; and

WHEREAS, The American Rescue Plan allows for reimbursement of vaccination related expenses, including that of EMS providers; and

WHEREAS, The Health & Human Services and Ways & Means Committees recommend approval of this resolution; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, Invoices received from EMS providers: Canandaigua Emergency Squad, Inc, Finger Lakes Ambulance EMS, Inc and Victor Farmington Ambulance Corps are hereby approved for calendar year 2022 expenses for COVID-19 vaccination related expenses in conjunction with the POD's conducted by Ontario County Public Health; and further

RESOLVED, These expenses will be paid and reimbursed by American Rescue Plan funds; and further

RESOLVED, That the Finance Department is authorized to make the necessary budgetary and accounting entries to affect the intent of this resolution; and further

RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be sent by the Clerk of this Board to the Canandaigua Emergency Squad, Inc, Finger Lakes Ambulance EMS, Inc and Victor Farmington Ambulance Corps.

WHEREAS, Ontario County has been awarded a contract and accepted monies from Health Research Incorporated (HRI) and the State of New York Department of Health (NYSDOH) Public Health Corps Fellowship Program (HRI Contract #15-2000.07; CFDA # 93.323 & 93.354; MUNIS# G21025) for the purpose of recruiting, managing, supporting and coordinating contracted public health fellowships in collaboration with the Ontario County Department of Public Health; and
